A new facility would later be constructed that opened in October. Also in January, our first secondary school started in Zambia with an 8th grade class of students that are from the very first kindergarten class that began in 2011. It is incredible to see what God is doing in the lives of these students as many have professed faith in Christ.

Through our mission trips, we were able to take 32 individuals from our church partners here in the United States in order to serve in various ways. These projects included conducting Vacation Bible Schools, discipleship training, community outreach, and our annual pastors' conference in Zambia. By God's grace, many professions of faith were made as we conducted outreach events in the surrounding villages.



#### Secondary School Education Begins in Zambia

Our secondary school students receive additional educational training, including specialized teachers per grade, computer and science lab training, as well as other vocational training related to home economics, hospitality, and agriculture. By 2023, our goal is to have students between the 8th-12th grades receiving secondary school education.

attended our Zambian Pastors' Conference, receiving both theological training and practical helps in ministry.




## New Restrooms Bring Running Water & Flushable Toilets
